



OFFICIAL STATEMENT FROM MÉXICO REPUBLICANO

Mexico City, July 2025

México Republicano expresses its deep concern over the tone and content of the recent exchange of statements between the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Mexico and the United States Ambassador, Mr. Ronald Johnson. Our nation cannot—and must not—become the stage for a rhetorical confrontation between global powers pursuing agendas that are foreign to the Mexican national interest.

Mexico is a sovereign nation. We are neither an ideological battleground nor a vehicle for foreign propaganda. The dignity of the Republic demands that all foreign diplomatic missions accredited in our territory conduct themselves with mutual respect, diplomatic prudence, and full adherence to the principles of non-intervention.

The relationship with the United States is strategic, historical, and deeply structural to the economy, security, and stability of millions of Mexican families. This relationship must be strengthened on the basis of shared values: economic freedom, institutional transparency, technological innovation, and respect for the rule of law. In times of global tension, Mexico must reaffirm its commitment to those who share a democratic vision of the world—not to those who seek to subjugate nations through conditional lending, technological dependency, or diplomatic coercion.

The statements made by the diplomatic representation of the People's Republic of China constitute an unnecessary and aggressive affront, unbecoming the language between civilized nations. To label the ambassador of an allied nation a "liar" is not only a breach of decorum but also a violation of the fundamental principles of international civility. México Republicano strongly condemns this verbal excess and calls upon the Federal Government to ensure that our territory is not used as a platform for hostility between global powers.

Mexican foreign policy must recover moral clarity, institutional firmness, and strategic coherence. Mexico cannot sail in ambiguous waters while the world redefines its alliances. We require international relations free from submission—but also free from ideological opportunism.
