### **México Republicano Condemns Ongoing Energy Support to the Cuban Regime and Warns of Possible International Sanctions**

México Republicano firmly rejects the continued energy support provided by the Federal Government to the Cuban regime, which—aside from being morally indefensible—poses a direct threat to Mexico’s national interest and financial stability.

1. **The ongoing shipment of oil and fuel to Cuba, reportedly under subsidized or even gratuitous conditions, is an affront to the people of Mexico**, whose resources must not be used to sustain foreign dictatorships. This repeated support has not been subjected to public scrutiny or justified economically or diplomatically.
2. **These operations, carried out by Petróleos Mexicanos (PEMEX), may constitute a direct violation of international regulations, particularly the U.S. Helms-Burton Act**, which prohibits economic cooperation with the Cuban regime and establishes potential sanctions against entities involved in such collaboration. Consequences may include trade sanctions and exclusion from the international financial system.
3. **The recent decision by the U.S. Export-Import Bank (EXIM Bank) to deny an \$800 million loan to PEMEX must not be overlooked**. This reflects serious concerns regarding the politicization of Mexico’s energy policy and the ideological misuse of a state-owned company that should operate under principles of transparency, efficiency, and profitability.
4. **México Republicano demands the immediate suspension of all subsidized oil and fuel exports to Cuba**, and calls for the public disclosure of all contracts, agreements, and shipment volumes made under the current administration. Continued opacity in this matter only increases the risk of legal and financial repercussions for our country.
5. **Mexico needs a foreign policy aligned with democratic principles, international law, and the defense of the national interest**. Our country must not continue compromising its sovereignty and economy to prop up a regime that systematically violates human rights and represses its own people.

México Republicano reaffirms its commitment to a responsible, transparent, and citizen-focused energy policy. Sovereignty is not defended by giving away oil—it is defended by protecting the people’s resources and upholding international legal standards.
