On the Accusations of “Treason Against the Nation”: A Necessary Clarification

In response to recent commentary published in certain opinion spaces — particularly the article “*Mexicans Kneeling Before Trump*” by Álvaro Delgado Gómez — which implies that members of the México Republicano movement may be engaging in conduct that constitutes **treason against the nation**, we state the following:

1. Treason is not an ideological slogan — it is a clearly defined criminal offense

The crime of treason against the nation, as established in Articles 123 to 127 of the Federal Criminal Code, only applies when an individual:

- Commits hostile acts against the Nation during wartime;
- Cooperates with foreign enemies;
- Engages in espionage, sabotage, conspiracy, or armed rebellion against Mexican state institutions;
- Attempts to submit national sovereignty to a foreign power through violent or clandestine means.

None of these circumstances apply to the actions of México Republicano or its members.

Our movement does not engage in acts of war, nor does it conspire with hostile powers. We do not threaten national sovereignty, nor do we act in secrecy. On the contrary: we operate publicly, transparently, and in full compliance with the democratic legal framework.

2. Participating in binational dialogue is not a crime — it is a constitutional right

The **Political Constitution of the United Mexican States**, in Articles 6 and 7, protects the freedoms of expression, association, and political participation.

México Republicano is composed of Mexican citizens — many with dual nationality, which is fully legitimate in a country with nearly 40 million nationals living in the United States — who are committed to strengthening institutions, the rule of law, and cooperation with our democratic allies in North America.

Engaging in public debate and proposing alternatives is not treason — it is democracy.

3. Baseless accusations are irresponsible and profoundly anti-democratic

To link the legitimate exercise of politics with a crime as serious as treason is a form of **ideological intimidation**. It is an attempt to discredit opposing ideas through moral persecution.

We at México Republicano strongly reject this authoritarian logic.

Dissenting from the current government is not treason.

Demanding strong action against organized crime is not treason.

Building bridges with those who share our values of liberty, order, and the rule of law is not treason.



4. True treason is handing the country over to organized crime

- Treason is abandoning entire regions to the cartels.
- Treason is using the State to protect networks of impunity.
- Treason is weakening institutions through populist ideology.
- Treason is remaining silent while organized crime hijacks national sovereignty.

Our movement was born precisely to confront the **institutional collapse** that enables this daily betrayal of honest and hardworking Mexicans.

Conclusion

At México Republicano, we defend national sovereignty with strength — and with intelligence. **We do not submit to any foreign power. We act with full awareness of our civic, legal, and moral responsibility.** And we will not accept the misuse of grave legal concepts as tools of ideological propaganda.

We will continue fighting for a Mexico of liberty, law, and order.
