



OFFICIAL STATEMENT OF MÉXICO REPUBLICANO

On the Institutional and Economic Situation Involving Grupo Salinas

México City, november 13th, 2025

México Republicano expresses its deep concern over the direction and nature of the recent proceedings involving Grupo Salinas, one of the country's most significant business conglomerates in terms of employment, investment, technological innovation, and the creation of opportunities in regions experiencing the highest levels of poverty.

Mexico faces a moment that demands institutional prudence and unwavering respect for the rule of law—not only because of the economic relevance of one of the nation's leading business groups, but also due to the potential implications these processes may have for social stability, investor confidence, and full compliance with the USMCA.

México Republicano underscores that no State institution should be used as an instrument of political pressure, intimidation, or retaliation, particularly when dealing with actors whose economic activity sustains jobs, supply chains, essential services, and mechanisms of social mobility that directly benefit millions of Mexicans.

National development requires legal certainty, clear rules, a reduction in confrontation, and a strengthened relationship between the public and private sectors based on respect—not coercion. The country cannot allow economic or fiscal processes to take on a punitive or exemplary tone that undermines trust in institutions or discourages investment.

We recognize the role that Grupo Salinas plays in promoting formal employment, expanding access to popular financial services, advancing digital connectivity, and consolidating jobs in marginalized sectors. For this reason, México Republicano firmly calls for any dispute with the State to be resolved with strict adherence to the law, free of ideological bias or political passion, ensuring the independence and professionalism of the authorities involved.

We also emphasize that economic freedom, competition, and regulatory certainty are fundamental principles established in the United States–Mexico–Canada Agreement (USMCA), and that weakening these principles would have direct consequences for national competitiveness and Mexico's strategic position in North America.

México Republicano urges institutions to conduct themselves with impartiality, objectivity, and transparency, and reiterates that any dispute between capital and the State must be resolved through dialogue, technical mechanisms, and institutional channels—not through political or media pressures that jeopardize the country's stability.

Mexico requires an environment of confidence, not persecution; of balance, not polarization; of legal certainty, not arbitrariness. México Republicano will maintain active vigilance over this and other processes that may affect economic freedom, property rights, investment conditions, and the institutional health of the Republic.
